How to Login to myLWC Portal

Your myLWC Portal has been activated. This will allow you to complete the necessary steps to further your enrollment. To access your account, go to portal.lindsey.edu and use the following:

Understand Your Financial Aid

To better understand your financial aid offer, please review the following items.

Institutional Grants/Scholarships: Institutional Grants and Scholarships are awarded by Lindsey Wilson. For more information, see www.lindsey.edu/financialaid.

Federal Grants: This federally funded grant (Pell Grant) is awarded on the basis of financial need. This grant is the foundation upon which all other aid is based.

Kentucky State Grants: These grants, funded by the Commonwealth of Kentucky, are awarded based on needs to Kentucky residents attending Kentucky colleges and are subject to the availability of funds. The grants are available as a Kentucky Tuition Grant (KTG) and/or College Access Program Grant (CAP).

KEES Scholarship: KEES scholarships are estimated based on your current award prior to your high school graduation and final grades. KHEAA requires students to maintain a minimum 2.5 cumulative GPA while in college to remain eligible for the KEES Scholarship each year.

Federal Student Work-Study: Students work on campus to earn money. There is a 6% tax that will be deducted from the wages earned. For example, a \$3,000 work-study award will result in approximately \$180 being withheld for taxes. Money and earnings can be directly applied to the student's account or receive a monthly paycheck. New spring students would be awarded \$1,500.

Federal Direct Subsidized Loan: This need-based program enables students to borrow an educational loan from the Department of Education. The loan is insured by the federal government, and the federal government pays the interest while the borrower is enrolled in school at least half-time, during a grace period, and authorized periods of deferment. Interest will begin to accrue from the beginning of the repayment period (six months after a student graduates or leaves school). The interest rate is variable, with a threshold of 8.25%.

All students that accept the Federal Direct Subsidized Loan must complete the online Entrance Counseling and Master Promissory Note (MPN) at www.studentaid.gov

This loan will have an origination fee (For example, in 2024-25 the fee was 1.057% for that year) which will be deducted from the total amount of the loan. Freshmen, dependent students are eligible to borrow \$5,500 in student loans for the year. (Subsidized and Unsubsidized combined)

Federal Direct Unsubsidized Loan: This is a non-need-based educational loan from the Department of Education. The student is responsible for the interest during in-school and deferment periods. Six months after the student graduates or leaves school, payments on the principal and interest begin. The interest rate is variable, with a threshold of 8.25%. Quarterly interest payments can be made while the students are in school, or students may allow interest to accrue. All students that accept the Federal Direct Unsubsidized Loan must complete the online Entrance Counseling and Master Promissory Note (MPN) at www.studentaid.gov

This loan will have an origination fee (For example, in 2024-25 the fee was 1.057% for that year) which will be deducted from the total amount of the loan.

Verification

Every year some FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) applicants are required to verify information submitted on their FAFSA. This process is important to ensure the proper amount of aid is going to the most qualified candidates. If selected for verification, the student must provide the information requested or he/she will not be eligible for state or federal aid. Students who are selected to complete verification will be notified by the Lindsey Wilson Financial Aid Office.

Veterans Affairs

LWC provides a Veterans Affairs Coordinator, Kachet Manners, whose office is located in Financial Aid. The VA Coordinator can be contacted at (270) 384-7449 or mannersk@lindsey.edu. Our office does not work for the Department of Veterans Affairs (DVA). We certify enrollment of veterans and dependents to the DVA.


Tuition Payment Plan

We offer a 4-month payment plan at a cost of \$55 for each semester. Students are able to invite another payer (e.g., mom, dad, aunt, uncle, etc.) that can make a payment or sign up for a payment plan without seeing anything else in the educational record of the student.

- Banking or credit card information can be saved on the site to have auto payments made.
- Students may access the payment plan option up until a week after classes started.
- The link will show on myLWC: www.lindsey.edu/pay. Payers may also go to www.lindsey.edu/paymentplan.
- The payment plans send out notices before payment is due.
- · If a student misses a payment, there is a grace period before a late fee is assessed.

Disability Services

Lindsey Wilson accepts students with disabilities and provides reasonable accommodation that will facilitate success. Depending on the nature of the disability, some students may need to take a lighter course load and may need more than four years to graduate. After acceptance, students must identify and document the nature of their disabilities with Jennie Shelpman (270-384-7479), the ADA Coordinator, or email adaoffice@lindsey.edu.

It is the responsibility of the student to provide the ADA Coordinator with appropriate materials documenting the learning disability. Learning disabilities are typically documented by a recent high school Individualized Education Program (IEP) and results from testing conducted by a psychologist, psychiatrist or a qualified, licensed person. Lindsey Wilson does not provide assessment services for students who may be learning disabled. Although Lindsey Wilson provides limited personal counseling for all students, the school does not have structured programs available for students with emotional or behavioral disabilities.

RaiderBucks

RaiderBucks are a safe, efficient and practical way to pay for things on campus. RaiderBucks allow the LWC ID card to serve as a personal on-campus debit card. There are NO barriers to care; students will always receive behavioral health services. Insurance will be billed for services, however, if a patient does not have insurance, services will still be provided.

Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 (FERPA)

Student records are maintained under the provision of the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 (FERPA). This federal act seeks to protect students' rights to access and to privacy by limiting access to student records to those persons authorized by the FERPA regulations or by individual students. Admissions, financial aid and student service files are retained for five years following the last date of enrollment.

The College reserves the right to contact a student's parent (or a physician of the student's choice) when, in the opinion of the College, notification is necessary to protect the health, well-being or safety of a student or other persons.

Access to Records

Students may inspect all records pertaining to them which are maintained by the school. The only exceptions to this access are those records exempted under FERPA:

- Directory information, as listed in this publication, is public unless the student requests, in writing, to the Registrar's Office that all or part of such information not be published
- · Name, local and home address, telephone numbers and date of birth
- · Dates of attendance, major field of study and degrees and awards received and
- Participation in recognized activities, organizations and sports (including weight and height or membership on athletic teams).

Access to any other information, except by persons authorized by the student, is strictly limited in accordance with FERPA regulations.

Accreditation

Health Insurance Information

Lindsey Wilson College is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges (SACSCOC) to award associate, baccalaureate, master's, and doctoral degrees. Degree-granting institutions also may offer credentials such as certificates and diplomas at approved degree levels.
