# How to Login to myLWC Portal

Your myLWC Portal has been activated. This will allow you to complete the necessary steps to further your enrollment. To access your account, go to portal.lindsey.edu and use the following:

## **Understanding Your Financial Aid**

To better understand your financial notification, please review the following items.

Institutional Grants/Scholarships: Institutional Grants and Scholarships are awarded by Lindsey Wilson College. For more information, see www.lindsey.edu/financialaid.

Federal Grants: This federally funded grant (Pell Grant) is awarded on the basis of financial need. This grant is the foundation upon which all other aid is based.

**Kentucky State Grants:** These grants, funded by the Commonwealth of Kentucky, are awarded, based on need to Kentucky residents attending Kentucky colleges and is subject to availability of funds. The grants are available as a Kentucky Tuition Grant (KTG) or College Access Program Grant (CAP).

KEES Scholarship: KEES scholarships are estimated based on your current award prior to your high school graduation and final grades. KHEAA requires students to maintain a minimum 2.5 cumulative GPA while in college to remain eligible for the KEES Scholarship each year.

Federal Student Work Study: Students work on campus approximately 11 hours a week to earn money for tuition, room and board expenses. There is a 6% tax that will be deducted from the wages earned. For example, a \$3,000 work-study award will result in approximately \$180 being withheld for taxes. Earnings can be directly applied to the student's account or receive a monthly paycheck. New spring students would be awarded \$1.500.

Federal Direct Subsidized Loan: This need-based program enables students to borrow an educational loan from the Department of Education. The loan is insured by the federal government, and the federal government pays the interest while the borrower is enrolled in school at least half-time, during a grace period, and during authorized periods of deferment. Interest will begin to accrue from the beginning of the repayment period (six months after a student graduates or leaves school). The interest rate is variable, with a threshold of 8.25%.

## All students that accept the Federal Direct Subsidized Loan must complete the online Entrance Counseling and Master Promissory Note (MPN) at www.studentloans.gov

This loan will have an origination fee (For example, in 2022-23 the fee was 1.057% for that year) which will be deducted from the total amount of the loan. Freshmen, dependent students are eligible to borrow \$5,500 in student loan for the year. (Subsidized and Unsubsidized combined)

Federal Direct Unsubsidized Loan: This is a non-need-based educational loan from the Department of Education. The student is responsible for the interest during in-school and deferment periods. Six months after the student graduates or leaves school, payments on the principal and interest begin. The interest rate is variable, with a threshold of 8.25%. Quarterly interest payments can be made while the students are in school, or students may allow interest to accrue. All students that accept the Federal Direct Unsubsidized Loan must complete the online Entrance Counseling and Master Promissory Note (MPN) at www.studentaid.gov This loan will have an origination fee (For example, in 2022-23 the fee was 1.057% for that year) which will be deducted from the total amount of the loan.

#### Verification

Every year some FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) applicants are required to verify information submitted on their FAFSA. This process is important to ensure the proper amount of aid is going to the most qualified candidates. If selected for verification, the student must provide the information requested or he/she will not be eligible for state or federal aid. KHEAA (Kentucky Higher Education Assistance Authority) has partnered with Lindsey Wilson College to make sure this process goes as smoothly as possible. #### **Veterans Affairs**

We certify enrollment of veterans and dependents to the DVA.

## **Semester Payments**

Semester payments will be made directly to Lindsey Wilson College. Fall semester payment is due by the first day of fall classes. Spring semester payment is due by the first day of spring classes. You have the following options when making a payment to Lindsey Wilson College:

## **Tuition Payment Plan**

We offer a 4-month payment plan at a cost of \$55 for each semester. Students are able to invite another payer (e.g., mom, dad, aunt, uncle, etc.) that can make a payment or sign up for a payment plan without seeing anything else in the educational record of the student.

- Banking or credit card information can be saved on the site to have auto payments made.
- Students may access the payment plan option up until a week after classes started.
- The link will show on myLWC: www.lindsey.edu/pay. Payers may also go to www.lindsey.edu/paymentplan.
- The payment plans send out notices before payment is due.
- If a student misses a payment, there is a grace period before a late fee is assessed.

This document serves as a contractual financial agreement with Lindsey Wilson College. On the promissory note, you will select one of the payment options described on page 7.

Your promissory note also displays your total charges less your financial aid. The balance due for each semester is indicated by "Total Due." If this amount is in parenthesis then it is a credit, and no amount is due. No matter what amount is due, **all students MUST e-sign their Promissory Note**.

Please review all terms and conditions, select your preferred payment option (Semester Payments or Tuition Payment Plan), and e-sign your promissory note.



#### **Class Accommodations**

Lindsey Wilson College accepts students with disabilities and provides reasonable accommodation that will facilitate success. Depending on the nature of the disability, some students may need to take a lighter course load and may need more than four years to graduate. Immediately after acceptance, students must identify and document the nature of their disabilities with Mr. Ben Martin (270-384-7479), the Learning & Physical Disabilities Coordinator. It is the responsibility of the student to provide the Learning disabilities are typically documented by a recent high school Individualized Education Program (IEP) and results from testing conducted by a psychologist, psychiatrist or a qualified, licensed person. The College does not provide assessment services for students who may be learning disabled. Although Lindsey Wilson provides limited personal counseling for all students, the College does not have structured programs available for students with emotional or behavioral disabilities.

The RaiderBucks account is automatically available when the student's LWC ID Card is created. All you have to do is add money to the card.

## Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 (FERPA)

Student records are maintained under the provision of the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 (FERPA). This federal act seeks to protect students' rights to access and to privacy by limiting access to student records to those persons authorized by the FERPA regulations or by individual students. Admissions, financial aid and student service files are retained for five years following the last date of enrollment.

The College reserves the right to contact a student's parent (or a physician of the student's choice) when, in the opinion of the College, notification is necessary to protect the health, well-being or safety of a student or other persons.

#### Access to Records

Students may inspect all records pertaining to them which are maintained by the College. The only exceptions to this access are those records exempted under FERPA:

- Directory information, as listed in this publication, is public unless the student requests, in writing, to the Registrar's Office that all or part of such information not be published
- Name, local and home address, telephone numbers and date of birth
- Dates of attendance, major field of study and degrees and awards received and
- Participation in recognized activities, organizations and sports (including weight and height or membership on athletic teams).

Access to any other information, except by persons authorized by the student, is strictly limited in accordance with FERPA regulations.


